Both parties maintain all privileges, immunities, and other rights granted by the Act and other applicable law. Each party carries insurance through the State

Risk Manager of the State of Utah up to the limits required by the State Risk Manager of the State of Utah and applicable law. Nothing in this Agreement shall require either party to carry different or additional insurance. It is not the intent of either party to incur by contract any liability for the operations, acts, or omissions of the other party or any third party and nothing in this Agreement shall be so interpreted or construed. In the event of any conflict, inconsistency, or discrepancy between the provisions of this paragraph and any other provisions of this Agreement, the provisions of this paragraph of the Agreement shall govern.

This agreement will remain in effect unless terminated in writing by either institution. This agreement will be reviewed annually, and renewal is contingent on the outcome of this review.
